Name	Max Height	Classifications	Habitat and Growth Characteristic, Typical Uses and Description
CONIFER TREES			
Douglas fir <i>Pseudotsuga menziesii</i>	250'		Well-drained soils. Used for windbreaks, firewood, and lumber. Fastest growing and most common conifer in Western Washington.
Grand fir <i>Abies grandis</i>	200'		Tolerates moist-dry soil. Fragrant, symmetrical tree which grows quickly. Often used as Christmas trees and lumber.
Noble fir <i>Abies procera</i>	250'		Found in rich soils. Prized for form, stiff branches, groomed needles, bluish color. Often used for Christmas trees/ lumber.
Shore pine <i>Pinus contorta</i>	50'		Highly adaptable. Found in bogs, dunes and rocky hilltops. Rapid growth. Can be planted in rows for boundary screening.
Sitka spruce <i>Picea sitchensis</i>	200'		Grows on moist sites, but not poorly drained soils. Stiff, bluish-green needles deter pests.
Western hemlock <i>Tsuga heterophylla</i>	200'		Found on humus as well as mineral soils. Graceful downward-sweeping branches and feathery foliage. State tree.
Western red cedar <i>Thuja plicata</i>	200'		Prefers moist soils. Used for lumber, firewood. Majestic J-shaped branches. Does not tolerate full sun when young.
BROADLEAF TREES			
Big-leaf maple <i>Acer macrophyllum</i>	115'		Dry to moist sites, often with Douglas fir. Handles disturbed sites well. Attractive moss, lichens and ferns grow on mature trees.
Bitter cherry <i>Prunus emarginata</i>	40'		Has attractive reddish bark. Attracts birds, butterflies and wildlife for food and shelter. Good alternative to invasive cherry species.
Cascara <i>Rhamnus purshiana</i>	35'		Small, slender tree with glossy leaves. Very versatile and resilient. Fruits are good wildlife forage.
Oregon ash <i>Fraxinus latifolia</i>	75'		Tough-wooded tree with unique compound leaves. Fast-growing and unpalatable to beavers.
Pacific willow <i>Salix lasiandra</i>	45'		Grows in wet margins and wet meadows. Attractive features year-round. Great for shading and stabilizing streams.
Paper birch <i>Betula papyrifera</i>	90'		Has distinctive white, peeling bark and attractive leaves, particularly with autumn color. Often used as an ornamental. Prefers moist soils.
Red alder <i>Alnus rubra</i>	90'		Very fast-growing tree. Does well in disturbed sites, and fixes nitrogen into the soil. Has attractive lichen-loving bark.
SHRUBS			
Baldhip rose <i>Rosa gymnocarpa</i>	5'		Has attractive pink flowers and lacy leaves. Is bristled rather than thorny. Rosehips are "bald" when sepals fall away. Fast-growing.
Evergreen huckleberry <i>Vaccinium ovatum</i>	8'		Has compact form grown in sun and is leggie in shade. Dark, glossy leaves. Delicious sweet berries for humans and wildlife.
Pacific ninebark <i>Physocarpus capitatus</i>	10'		Has cinnamon-colored, peeling bark and clustered white flowers. Excellent at soil-binding, and is great for restoration and hedges
Pacific rhododendron <i>Rhododendron macrophyllum</i>	12'		Beautiful clusters of large pink flowers against whorled leathery leaves. Great in both forests and landscaping. State flower.
Red elderberry <i>Sambucus racemosa</i>	15'		Distinct arched branches and compound leaves. Pyramidal white flowers and red berries - great for wildlife. Absorbs soil toxins.
Red osier dogwood <i>Cornus sericea</i>	8'		Fast-growing thicket-forming, with bright red stems and clusters of white flowers. Easily pruned in landscaping or great in a natural setting.
Tall Oregon grape <i>Mahonia aquifolium</i>	6'		Dark, glossy leaves and bright yellow flower clusters. Great in disturbed areas, landscaping, and hedges. Good alternative to invasive holly.
Thimbleberry <i>Rubus parviflorus</i>	6'		An upright bramble shrub with no thorns. Has large, velvety leaves and delicious tart thimble-shaped berries. Tolerates browsing.
Western serviceberry <i>Amelanchier alnifolia</i>	15'		Attractive branching pattern and thin, oval leaves. Produces fragrant, showy white flowers and a sweet, berry-like fruit. Well-drained soils.
GROUND COVERS & VINES			
Big-leaf lupine <i>Lupinus polyphyllus</i>	3'		Robust perennial with attractive spires of blue-purple flowers. Good in landscaping, disturbed areas, and natural settings. Nitrogen-fixer.
Coastal strawberry <i>Fragaria chiloensis</i>	8"		Perennial which spreads quickly through stolons and rhizomes. Binds soil. Has attractive white flowers and delicious berries.
Kinnikinnick <i>Arctostaphylos uva-ursi</i>	8"		A mat-forming evergreen shrub producing pink flowers and berries. Common in landscaping and rain gardens.
Orange trumpet honeysuckle <i>Lonicera ciliosa</i>	20'		Climbing vine with clusters of tubular bright orange flowers. Valuable nectar and berries for wildlife - great attractant for hummingbirds!
Salal <i>Gaultheria shallon</i>	4'		Creeping to erect evergreen shrub with branching stems and leathery leaves. Common in landscaping and forests.
Sword fern <i>Polystichum munitum</i>	3'		Robust deciduous fern with large dark green fronds. Common in forests and landscaping. Provides amphibian habitat.
EXTRAS			
Tree Tubes and Stakes	2'		Plastic plant coverings which protect seedlings from rodent, deer, and trimmer damage.
Plantskydd Animal Repellent	1 lb.		Very effective odor-based herbivore repellent. Lasts 3-4 months in the growing season and up to 6 months in the winter.
